* The College Cost Reduction Act of 2007

- Description: A public service loan forgiveness program that will discharge any remaining educational debt after 10 years of full-time employment in public service. Loan forgiveness would be offered to those who hold public service jobs (including social workers in a public child or family service agency). The interest rate on subsidized student loans would be cut in half, from 6.8 percent to 3.4 percent, over four years beginning in 2008.
